

One Memory Verse from Each Chapter of Acts

Acts 1	8	You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.
Acts 2	24	But God raised Him from the dead, freeing Him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on Him.
Acts 3	19	Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.
Acts 4	10	It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead, that this man stands before you healed.
Acts 5	31	God exalted Him to His own right hand as Prince and Savior that He might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to Israel.
Acts 6	7	The Word of God spread.
Acts 7	48	The Most High does not live in houses made by men.
Acts 8	4	Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went.
Acts 9	18	Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized.
Acts 10	43	All the prophets testify about Him that everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins through His name.
Acts 11	18	God has granted even the Gentiles repentance unto life.
Acts 12	5	Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him.
Acts 13	38	Through Jesus the forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you.
Acts 14	15	We too are only men, human like you. We are bringing you good news, telling you to turn from these worthless things to the living God, who made heaven and earth and sea and everything in them.
Acts 15	11	It is through the grace of our Lord Jesus that we are saved.
Acts 16	14	The Lord opened her [Lydia's] heart to respond to Paul's message.
Acts 17	11	The Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.
Acts 18	28	He [Paul] vigorously refuted the Jews in public debate, proving from the Scriptures that Jesus was the Christ.
Acts 19	4	John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. He told the people to believe in the One coming after him, that is, in Jesus.
Acts 20	24	I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace.
Acts 21	13	I am ready not only to be bound, but also to die in Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus.
Acts 22	16	Now what are you waiting for? Get up, be baptized and wash your sins away, calling on his name.
Acts 23	11	The Lord stood near Paul and said, "Take courage! As you have testified about Me in Jerusalem, so you must also testify in Rome."
Acts 24	16	I strive always to keep my conscience clear before God and man.
Acts 25	11	If, however, I am guilty of doing anything deserving death, I do not refuse to die.
Acts 26	8	Why should any of you consider it incredible that God raises the dead?
Acts 27	25	Keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me.
Acts 28	23	From morning till evening he explained and declared to them the kingdom of God and tried to convince them about Jesus from the Law of Moses and from the Prophets.
